

Invitation to participate in group discussion for a research study about orthopaedic services

Are you aged over 60?

Would you be willing to participate in a group discussion to help inform a research study about orthopaedic services in the NHS?

Background

Researchers at University College London (UCL) are planning to run group discussions with patients and members of the public in March 2018 and are looking for your help. The purpose of these groups is to understand what you think about changes to orthopaedic services in the NHS that aim to improve patient outcomes. We are particularly interested in hearing your views about what you think might be important when patients are having planned surgery to treat a specific problem (e.g. having a hip or knee replacement). **You do not need to have had surgery before to take part in the group. We simply require that you are aged over 60 and are not currently on a NHS hospital waiting list for orthopaedic surgery.**
