

## Summary

Domestic violence is a significant public health problem that requires a broad and integrated response across the wider health care system, including third sector organisations. Identification and Referral to Improve Safety (IRIS) is an intervention programme to improve the primary care response to domestic violence. In a cluster randomised controlled trial within primary care practices in London and Bristol, it was shown that IRIS cost-effectively improved identification and referral.

Our RPT is contributing to the wider [IRIS project](#) by providing a statistical evaluation of the impact of disrupted provision of IRIS in two boroughs.
